Context

In April 2015, Interarts (Spain) in collaboration with BAC Art Centre (Tunisia), Gudran for Art and Development (Egypt), Khayal Arts & Education (Lebanon), the National Centre for Culture and Arts King Hussein Foundation - NCCA (Jordan) and the German Commission for UNESCO - DUK (Germany) initiated the "Communities of practice for the public value of culture in the Southern Mediterranean – SouthMed CV" project co-funded by the European Commission in the framework of the regional programme Med Culture².

SouthMed CV aims to bring culture from the margins to the center of the public sphere, exploring its potential connections with economic, social and political development strategies.

In the context of SouthMed CV two calls for proposals were launched in 2015 and 2016. They were aimed at supporting cultural and artistic projects that contribute to strengthening the role of culture in social inclusion, urban development, human rights, education, environment etc. A total of **38 projects** have received sub-granting from SouthMed CV and have been implemented in **Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine** and **Tunisia**.

To showcase the results and conclusions of the SouthMed CV project, two international events have been foreseen: a **regional conference** was organised on 3 and 4 December 2017 **in Amman** (Jordan)³ and a **final conference** will be held on 10 April 2018 at the **Centre for Fine Arts - BOZAR**, in **Brussels** (Belgium).

Objectives

The **final conference** in Brussels have the following objectives:

- ▶ Present SouthMed CV's results: impact and outcomes of the 38 projects supported in the Southern Mediterranean, and the printed book 'Mahattat'.
- ► Convene EU representatives, media and other key stakeholders that are present in the Southern Mediterranean region to raise their awareness as to the role of culture as a vector for sustainable human development in the region.
